
Disparities in Opioid Deaths

COLORADO Disparities in Medicare FFS Opioid Deaths Apr 2020 to March 2021: Above average rates in Black and Native American Beneficiaries




REGIONAL* Disparities in Medicare FFS Opioid Deaths Apr 2020 to March 2021:
